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ICPC-2 and ICD-10 a difficult relation in the WHO-FIC

Problems of ICD-10 for PC


- Granularity too high/ too big
- Too specific/ missing specificity
- Missing reasons for encounter/ process-codes
- Missing meaningful higher level codes

Advantages of ICPC-2 for PC

- Granularity low (roughly right vs. exactly wrong)
- Specific for PC
- Codes for RfE, diagnoses and processes
- Offers meaningful higher level codes for ICD-10 via the mapping

What we have now: ICPC-2 often maps to several chapters and different levels of ICD-10

The relationship is distant and complicated



What we learned about ICD-11 in Brasilia:


ICD-11: similar on surface, but different in structure

the basic content can be viewed on different telescopic levels

This telescopic structure is called primary care linearization

ICPC-2: - strictly sorted by localization

- 1,404 terms
- RfE, diagnoses and processes

ICD-10: - sorted by etiology and localization

- approximately 14,000 terms
- mainly diagnoses
