ICF

ICF work is ongoing but still at the level of the conceptual framework so not using it through the specific codes (so not as the classification in its pure sense) I don't think my current ICF work is very relevant to WICC but I still believe it to be a very useful classification for family doctors to shift the focus from the disease to the person and for interprofessional collaboration and alignment with other providers' electronic records.

We'll see where we are ten years from now :)

ACG

In 2015 we have incorporated ICPC data from five community health centers into ACG. I have sent out an email to my colleagues who have been doing this work to report on what would be really useful for WICC to know. I can already say that as compared to five years ago it did work - so we have been able to construct ACG rubs out of ICPC data. My colleague who has done the work told me it was quite user friendly and it did not feel as if she was working with a black box. Unfortunately the research license expired before we had a chance to look at it together. I know there were some plans that the government would buy an ACG license so we would be able to use it further but that plan seems to have died somewhere on the way. As I said, I have sent out an email to understand where the barriers are. Will come back to you on that
