

## Report from France for 2015-6

French public health authorities show more and more interest in ICPC. The French agency for shared health information systems (ASIP-santé) aims at developing a governance model and a public portal for health terminologies at national level. This agency considers ICPC-2 as the appropriate classification for documenting health problems and reasons for encounter in primary care medicine. We have reasonable hopes that France could pay the licence fees for ICPC-2.

The French College of general practice, which is now the French member organization of Wonca, wishes to create a registration-based network in general practice, to provide comprehensive data on general practice consultations. Two members of the CISP-Club are participating to the working group in charge of this project.

The French society for general practice (SFMG) has recently mapped its Dictionary of consultation results (DRC), which is a nomenclature for French general practice, to ICPC-2.

Laurent Letrilliart has proposed to host the 2017 WICC meeting in Lyon (presumably in October, but to be confirmed).
