

WICC report Japan 2016

Since 2014, Japan Primary Care Association started TransHis project with the help of professor Kees van Boven. We will start to certificate general practitioners as one of 17 medical specialists in 2017. We want to show the image of GP with the TransHis project.

Japanese government does not adopt ICPC till now and we have to use ICD-10 in daily practice. It means we cannot get statistical data in daily practice except for diagnosis. TransHis project will show the power of ICPC to our government.

The aging of society is rapidly progressing in Japan. We started the integrated remodeling of medical care and nursing care in 2014. This remodeling will last until 2025.
